Linda McFadden (Lake County Sheriff's Office) will deliver the card on behalf of the Association.

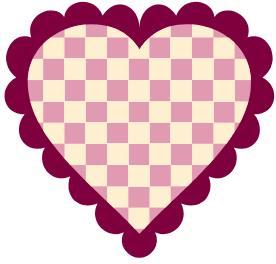

Margaret Levins, SCSO reported the free Internet Safety Class for Parents is set up with dates and location on the SO website at www.seminolesheriff.org.

Linda McFadden, Lake County SO reported they are planning a Kops & Kids event in conjunction with the March of Dimes.

Linda Harville, Lake County SO reported a CPA in Clermont and they are up-dating their crime prevention brochures.

Bryan Tittle, Orange County SO reported the creation of a Citizen's Corp including Neighborhood Watch, COP program CERT and other parts of the SO, working together to prepare of emergencies and disasters. They work with residents to prepare of at least 72hrs of being on their own before help can get to them.

The Crime Prevention Unit is trying different marketing tools to get their services out to the public, using PSA's and radio.

Orange County SO has a new Mobile Command Unit with state of the art equipment.

Bob Samson, Marriott Vacation Club International reported that at least \$2 million and 200 people working for 2 months to help identify all those who had their information compromised by the missing files at Marriott. He advised members to remain vigilant to their information to prevent the loss of valuable data.

Cynthia Pabon, Kissimmee PD reported a CPA graduation coming up in March; practicing Code Red in local schools; working on Business Watch; making child restrain checks at the PD and once a month at a school; working with the **Flee to be Free** program and have begun sending letters to burglary victims offering services to them.

Melissa Cope, Osceola County SO reported they were working with banks for robbery training, setting a seminar where 21 banks were invited, 13 showed up; Jan 23 they started an Advanced CPA, and they are planning an Appreciation Dinner.

Karen Murphy, Osceola County SO reported they have begun getting involved with the Special Olympics and have hats and T-shirts; they are also doing the Tip-A-Cop event in their area for this event.

Round Table (con't)

Zack Hudson, Casselberry PD reported they are working with local banks with training and working on a Rapid Response Team for emergencies.

Tom Maroney, Ocoee PD reported they have been working with ATF on Beer Buys using youths to make underage purchases at local stores; they have a CPA in session now; they have involved the PTA in fingerprinting kids at schools. They have increased their Explorers Unit with new recruits; and they are doing more Stranger /Danger programs for children.

Troy MacDonald, Sanford PD reported they are working more with Neighborhood Watch groups, meeting every month in some cases to help residents with issues. They have found this to be very effective in reducing incidents of crime in some communities they are attempting to create an e-mail network to keep residents advised of activity in areas of the city.

Melissa Allums, Orange County Consumer Fraud reported they are working with TRIAD and training members for a Complaint Desk type of setup. As to what the SAO does to help and they have references on a website for assistance to businesses.

Kim Van Arsdale, Clermont PD reported she is new to the Crime Prevention Unit.

Rene Castro, Clermont PD reported he is being transferred to the Criminal Investigative Bureau and may be working with Crime Prevention.

Brian Meyers, Maitland PD thanked everyone for the information he received about Bike Paths and Crime Prevention. He had sent a request to Rich Kay and Rich forwarded his request throughout the state via e-mail and Brian received a lot of good ideas.

Alicia Ramirez, Orlando Citizens Neighborhood Watch- reported they are doing training on anti-terrorism for neighborhoods. They have started a Citizens Police Academy for businesses, with 30 businesses now in attendance, focusing mainly on Economic Crimes. They also have started their 5th Hispanic Citizens Police Academy.

Laurie Bailey, Seminole County SO is new to the Crime Prevention Unit and is working mainly with Children's programs. She is re-vamping literature for children.

Ed Schierholzer, Seminole County SO is working to redesign most of the brochures the SO gives out. He is up-dating information, phone numbers and making them more user friendly.

Tom Ford, New Smyrna Beach PD reported they are setting up neighborhood watch organizations and also re-designing their handout brochures.
