ROUNDTABLE:

Marriott Vacation Club: Fraud issues continue to occur and they are attempting to stop as much as they can.

UCF PD: UCF football is USA Conference Champions!!! Congrats to them and UCF. Students are going home for the holidays and they are being encouraged to take valuable property with them or to secure them. UCF PD is assisting Oviedo PD with their DARE graduation.

Winter Garden PD: They are collecting toys for needy families for the holiday season, they have 138 families right now but it is still growing. They are also using decoy cars at banks to attempt to prevent robberies.

Orange County S.O.: The department is going through a re-organization period due to some of the administration retiring or leaving the department. They are also working with Channel 9 for the toys for tots program. They are also working on distributing weather radios for free to the public.

Orlando PD: Officer Nguyen was very thankful for the items donated for him and his family, thank you all for the help. OPD is concerned about alarm systems going from analog to digital and some alarms systems not working properly. This change is suppose to take place in a few months.

Orange County Consumer Fraud: They had a shred-a-thon and it was covered very well by the media, several Government officials were on hand during this event.

Osceola County S.O.: They are having shop with a Deputy on 12/12/2007 at Wal-Mart. Money donated by local businesses, each child will have \$100 dollars to spend.
