Minutes of the Meeting: JUNE 6, 2006

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer Linda McFadden gave a report to the membership.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Tony Seda offered a motion seconded by Ed Schierholzer to accept the Minutes of the May meeting. Motion approved.

MARK WEIMER, CHIEF OF POLICE for the Kissimmee Police Department welcomed the CFCPA to Kissimmee today. He thanked his Crime Prevention personnel for the fine job they do and told us to feel at home in Kissimmee. He supports the work of the CFCPA and wished us well in the future.....Thank you Chief for your remarks.

PRESIDENT'S TIME: President Linda Harville welcomed members to the Kissimmee Police Department and thanked them for hosting this month's meeting.

President Harville reminded members that if they want to attend any class sponsored by the FCPTI (Office of Attorney General), the course fee ONLY will be paid for by CrimeLine of Central Florida. Members were advised on how to apply for this.

She advised members that the next meeting will be held on **Tuesday July 11** because of the holiday, and will be hosted by the Lake Mary Police Department. Location will be sent to all members when available.

OLD BUSINESS:

Crime Prevention Flier: Linda Harville reported the CFCPA Crime Prevention fliers are completed and copies will be printed. The display boxes that **Bill Ford** spoke about a few meetings ago will try to be obtained and each member agency business will receive a box and a quantity of fliers to give out.

Proposed By-Law Amendment: Marian Hultgreen explained her amendment pertaining to a member is good standing. This was discussed by members and voted on. The amendment was approved unanimously. There were no nay votes. Secretary will amend the By-Laws and send each member a new copy.

NEW BUSINESS:

Consumer Protection Forum in Orlando: Dave Blacklock, Sr vs Crime, had e-mailed members information pertaining to a June 20th Forum he is attempting to put on. He asked members for assistance with instructors and a location to hold it.

The plan is to hold a two hour forum to provide consumer protection instructions to about 160 consumers ages 50 to 60 years of age in Central Florida. The Attorney General is scheduled to appear at about 2pm and speak.

He immediately received support from: **Melissa Allums**, Orange County Consumer Fraud that they could assist; **Zack Hudson** of Casselberry PD made arrangements to use the Casselberry Senior Center; the CFCPA will help with up to \$100.00 for anything he might need. Additional funding could be made available if needed.

NOVA- National Organization for Victim Assistance-Terri Goodwin, Office of the State Attorney in Titusville advised the members that NOVA will hold its 32nd Annual North American Victim Assistance Conference at the Rosen Hotel in Orlando August 20-25th. She also advised that a second conference by the World Society of Victimology will be held at the same time, same place. This historic event enables Central Florida to shine concerning victim assistance.

Terri advises they are anticipating over 3,000 participants to attend these two conferences, with representatives from across the nation as well as advocates from over 40 countries.

Terri is appealing for items that would promote Central Florida agencies and will also be used to auction off. This donation would benefit the SAO enormously as they plan for this event.

Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

May 2, 2006

The CFCPA Board of Directors met this date with the following members in attendance:

President Ford advised the Board of Directors that he must resign as President effective immediately due to a change in his employment situation.

He will not be able to fulfill the duties as President; however he wants to continue his involvement with the Association.

The Board discussed options and decided that Vice President Linda Harville will take over as President. Bill Ford will become Vice President.

These changes will remain in effect until the general elections in September 2007, unless things change again for Bill and he has to leave altogether.

This action was taken under the authorization of Article VI, Section 4 and 7 of the CFCPA By-Laws.

Marian Hultgreen- Orange County Sheriff's Office offered a By-Law Amendment

"I propose the following By-Law amendment, re-defining "Member in Good Standing" as defined in Article III-Membership.

Presently it reads: "**Member in Good Standing: A member whose dues are paid in full.**"

Proposed adding the following... " **and has attended 8 of the last 12 monthly meetings.**"

This would make Article III to read as follows: "**Member in Good Standing: A member whose dues are paid in full and has attended 8 of the last 12 monthly meetings.**"

The Secretary will advise the membership, as required via the By-Laws, and set June 6th as the voting date for this amendment.
